

ARACHNĒ

Arachnē puella Gracca arte clāra erat. Pater eius lānās mūrīce tinguēbat. Puella tamen per omnēs terrās nōmen memorābile habuit quamquam nōn dives sed pauper erat. Rudem lānam in p̄imos orbēs glomerābat, opus digitīs subigēbat, vellera molliēbat, teretem pollice celerī versābat. Tandem autem superba erat et haec improba verba ēdidit, "Melius labōrō quam Minerva. Si dea veniet, facile eam vincam." Minerva haec verba audivit et anun simulāvit; cānōs capillōs sibi addidit, baculum sumpsit quod infirma crūra sustinuit. Cameram, ubi audāx puella laborābat, intrāvit, et opus spectāvit. Tandem dulcī vōce, "Mea filia," inquit, "anus sum et multa cognōvī; meum consilium audī. Aspectus Iovis rēgālis erat. Deus maris aspera saxa longō tridente feriēbat unde equus saliēbat. Minerva sē ipsam in pictūrā pinxit, et sibi clipeum et hastam et galeam dedit. Illa etiam terram feriēbat, unde olea, gravis bācīs, surgēbat. In angulis mortālēs quī deōs lacessivērunt addidit. Arachnē contrā deōs quī errāvērunt pinxit. Pulchritūdō pictūrae mīra erat.
